Supplies

Material	Type
Paper	<p>At least ten (10) sheets of 9 in. x 12 in. or 16 in. x 20 in. hot press (smooth)</p> <p>watercolor paper</p> <p>The bigger dimension (16 x 20) is better, if it is in stock and available.</p>
Eraser	One kneaded (linked), one white rubber (linked) eraser
Pencil Sharpener	Handheld (link) is best
Pencils	<p>Pencils (link) in a range of grades:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• HB• 2B• 6B or 8B

Pens	A Bamboo reed pen (linked)
Ink	Walnut ink (linked) is great, but also any sepia or brown ink will do.
Drawing Board	<p>Any board large enough to hold your paper, with some clips to hold it on there will work.</p> <p>Here (linked) is one that comes with clips.</p>
Sketchbook (optional)	A sketchbook would be helpful to make notes and quick preparatory sketches, but it is not required. Students can use their regular sketchbooks if they have one already.
