Costiniano is a Filipino-American arts professional and curator focusing largely on accessibility and diversity in the arts, placemaking through public art, and contemporary arts at the varied intersections of gender, race, and queer theory. She studied art history at the University of North Texas.

Prior to her most recent position as Creative Project Manager and Gallery Director at ArtWorks in Cincinnati, Costiniano has worked with a variety of north Texas organizations including the Dallas Museum of Art, Ro2 Art, and the Contemporary Art Dealers of Dallas.

Her most notable work was completed as the Founder and Director of ARThaus, a grassroots non-profit she started in Denton, Texas. Seeking a more robust and accessible art community during her last year of university, she founded a space for creatives and art enthusiasts to connect, collaborate, and gain valuable experience.

Through the work at ARThaus, Costiniano and her team were able to cultivate a flourishing sense of community by facilitating solo and group exhibitions, artist residencies, workshops, classes, multiple editions of a community zine, and open critique sessions all at no cost to the participants.
