*Suggested colors: Cadmium or Pyrrole Red, Ultramarine Blue, Cobalt Blue, Phthalo Green, Cobalt Green, Lemon Yellow or Cadmium Yellow, Yellow Ochre, Burnt Sienna, Burnt Umber, Ivory Black

Brush Options

Simply Simmons (cheap acrylic brushes, but not very good) or Princeton Neptune (moderate price, recommended)

- 1 no. 3 round
- 1 no. 8 round
- 1 no. 12 round
- 1 no. 16 round
- 1 One inch flat (Acrylic brush)
- 1- Small Mop brush (Watercolor brush- any maker)
- * Consider getting one Black Velvet (size 12 or 14), does just about everything

Suggested Brushes

Black Velvet (expensive but so worth it)

- 1 no. 6 round
- 1 no. 12 or 14 round
- 1 One inch flat (Acrylic brush- any maker)
- 1- Small Mop brush (Watercolor brush- any maker)

Suggested Paper

Fluid brand Watercolor Paper (Cold Press) 140 lb., 16" x 20" or 12" x 16" Arches (100% Cotton) Watercolor Paper (Cold Press) 140 lb. 16" x 20" or 12" x 16"

Arches is the best; however, it is twice as expensive. Not necessary for this class.
