

Color for Beginners

MATERIALS NEED

Paints: Acrylics

Titanium White - 5 oz.

Ivory Black/Carbon Black - 2 oz.

Cadmium Red Medium Hue* - 2 oz.

Cadmium Yellow Light Hue* - 2 oz.

Ultramarine Blue (Red Shade)** - 2 oz.

Permanent Green Light or Light Permanent Green – 2 oz.

Dioxazine Purple – 2 oz. - optional

<u>Suggested brands:</u> Liquitex Heavy Body, Golden Heavy Body, Windsor and Newton. DO NOT BUY LIQUITEX BASICS or another cheap brand as they are difficult to work with.

*You do not have to buy the more expensive "real" version of these paints with the true pigment. The ones labeled "hue" will be fine for the class.

**Liquitex has two versions of Ultramarine Blue – get the "red" shade

Paint Brushes

Bright or flat for acrylic with synthetic hair, sizes #4, #6, #8

A round brush either size #4 or #6. Suggested Brands: Liquitex Basic, Grumbacher Bristlette.

***While it is good to have all three of these, you can get by with just the #4 and #8

Bright/flat if necessary

Canvas Boards (6)

8" x 10" (Fredrix or any brand will do). Optional: (2) larger-sized canvas boards, any size but no bigger than 12" x 16".

Bristol Paper Pad

Smooth or Vellum, 9" x 12" Brands: Canson, Strathmore

Disposable Paper Painting Palette or other flat painting palette

Palette/painting knife

Liquitex Freestyle Small Knife #15 or similar – see illustration below (avoid plastic if possible).

Pencil - 2B


Eraser - Soft white eraser

Ruler - 12" metal or plastic

Plastic Containers for water

Spray Bottle for water – available at dollar stores, Target, etc.

Rags – old t-shirts, etc.
